**Guide to Owl Watching in North America** by Donald S. Heintzelman. 1992. 194 pp. A small reference paperback with excellent black and white photographs and a listing of owl-watching sites by state (no Maine sites listed). \$8.95

**Owls: The Silent Fliers** by R.D. Lawrence. 2001. 176 pp. An up-to-date reference with full-color photos, covering many aspects of general owl biology and behavior as well as species accounts for most North American species. \$19.95

**Owls: A Wildlife Handbook** by Kim Long. 1998. 192 pp. A small but detailed reference book covering the North American species as well as diet, behavior, reproduction and migration. \$15.95

**Owls** by Connie Toops. 1990. 128 pp. Informative but not technical reading, complemented by extensive color photos. \$19.95
